Your firebreaks should be 3 metres wide and 4 metres high and have room to turn in to and around cornersif our truck cannot drive on your firebreak we may not be able to manage fire on your property!

The members of Chidlow Volunteer Bushfire Brigade would like to wish you all a very good 2020. We look forward to another year of teamwork, training and dedication in service of our community.

With so much fire activity here in WA, and especially with the devastating scenes we have witnessed in the Eastern States, we would like to remind you what a Total Fire Ban Day actually means.

DFES says that it declares a Total Fire Ban on a day when a fire is most likely to spread rapidly (because of extreme fire weather) or if there are already widespread fires and they don't have the resources to fight more.

A Total fire Ban means you are not allowed to light an open-air fire or conduct any activity that could start a fire. This includes lighting a campfire, using a welder, grinder or incinerator, conducting a burnoff, burning leaves and garden waste, firing up a wood or charcoal BBQ, using a wood-fired pizza oven, driving a vehicle in fire-prone areas and more.

For further information, search "DFES" and "Total Fire Ban" and follow the links on the DFES site. If in doubt, leave it for a cooler day. You don't want to be the one explaining to the authorities how the fire started in your back paddock because you were, for instance, mowing on a Total Fire Ban day!



IS LAKE LESCHENAULTIA A HEALTHY LAKE?

On a cool summer's morning in January families met at Lake Leschenaultia to take water samples and assess the health of the lake. Recording pH and salinity levels and discovering what is lurking beneath the water's surface is an effective way to do this.

The cool morning didn't stop eager children and adults wading through the water to collect water samples and find macro animals which were identified using identification charts and Iscopes. They



found fresh water snails; leeches; water boatmen; damselfly larvae; caddis fly larvae and dragonfly larvae and of course lots of shrimp and gambusia fish (Mosquito fish, which is a pest species found

in most water bodies in Australia). Participants tested pH and salinity using a water meter and then compared the pH using common pool or fish tank pH strips, which proved to be very accurate.

The value of captivating a group of people and introducing them to an aquatic ecosystem cannot be underestimated. This activity was an opportunity to discuss the

impact people have on local catchments and consequently the health of the Swan River. Lake Leschenaultia belongs to the Wooroloo Brook catchment which is made up of many tributaries that run into the Wooroloo Brook, which then flows into the Swan River at the confluence of the Avon and Swan River. Human activities such as feeding water birds can have a negative effect on the health of the native animals plus increase the nutrient levels in the water. This increases soil bacteria which can lead to avian botulism, which commonly results in paralysis in the birds. Other activities such as littering, erosion from vehicles and the spread of weeds all decrease the quality of the water, which directly effects native plants and animals using it for survival.



Lake Leschenaultia supports the lives of many native animals, i.e. frogs, water birds, reptiles and mammals and of course the macro-invertebrates. It was great to be able to investigate and pronounce the lake HEALTHY!




